Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is everyone's responsibility and our top priority. Anyone who comes in to contact with children and their families has a role to play. WHAT IS SAFEGUARDING?

CURRICULUM

WE TEACH CHILDREN HOW TO KEEP THEMSELVES SAFE THROUGH OUR LESSONS AND ACTIVITIES. SAFEGUARDING IS PART OF OUR WHOLE CURRICULUM. EXAMPLES INCLUDE: PSHE 'USING TENTEN' LESSONS (NURSERY-YEAR 2), ONLINE SAFETY IN COMPUTING, NSPCC VISITS AND EVENTS, AND ANTI-BULLYING WEEK.

REPORTING CONCERNS

Children are taught who to talk to if they feel worried or scared, and posters around school remind them they can approach any member of staff. We encourage openness about feelings and reassure pupils that we are here to listen and help. If staff or volunteers have concerns about a child, they must report them to our safeguarding team.

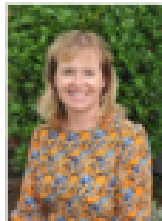
