Sticky Knowledge



- Jesus enters Jerusalem (Lk 19:28-38*)
- The last supper (Lk 22:7-23*, 28-34)
- The Crucifixion and death of Jesus (Lk 23:33-46*)
- The angel's message (Lk 24:1-8*)
- Peter at the tomb (Lk 24:9-12)



- That Jesus gave us the Sacrament of Reconciliation to heal and restore our friendship with God and through this ourselves.
- That Lent is a time of preparing our hearts and minds for Easter through reconciliation and forgiveness.
- The Easter Vigil Mass is the high point of the year and is rich in symbols of light and darkness.



Some prayers and actions in which Catholics turn back to God, in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, for example, a simple Examen, an act of sorrow, in the Penitential rite-the Kyrie Eleison (Lord have Mercy).

- Some simple words, actions, and symbols of the Easter Vigil, focusing on light and water.



- The importance of saying sorry to God and to others.
- That prayer can help people say sorry for their sins.
- That making bad choices damages relationships and damages them.

Skills I need to use

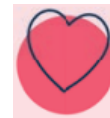


Recognise what Jesus said on the cross about forgiveness and make simple connections with the belief that God always forgives us.

Recognise that Lent is a time for reconciliation and forgiveness.

Use religious words and phrases when describing the Sacrament of Reconciliation, making simple connections between the sacrament and a belief in God's forgiveness.

Use religious words and phrases to talk about the symbols of light and water in the Easter Vigil Mass.



Look at art to recall the story of Holy Week.

Consider examples of reconciliation and peacebuilding in art.

Listen to versions of the Kyrie Eleison and talk about what the words mean.

Talk about links between the symbols of light and water at the Easter Vigil and what the symbols remind them of.



Think about what forgiveness means to them.

Think about how making bad choices can harm themselves and others and why saying sorry matters.

Reflect on how Jesus teaches people to forgive.
