Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope this letter finds you and your family well. As a very busy Spring term comes to an end, I would like to inform you of important developments to do with the running of our school.

### **Christus Catholic Trust**

Following on from our parent consultation in the Autumn term, we are now officially part of the Christus Catholic Trust. The Trust comprises of six other Catholic Primary Schools situated in the South Essex Deanery.

St Thomas of Canterbury in Grays

St Peter's in Billericay

St Joseph's in Stanford Le Hope

St Mary's in Tilbury

St Teresa's in Basildon

Holy Cross in South Ockendon

In his letter on Education Sunday, Bishop Alan restated his request for Catholic Multi-Academy Trusts saying that he saw them as "... an opportunity for schools to work together actively and formally to shape the Catholic education system in their locality. It is this approach that will enable high standards of Catholic education to be maintained and where schools can contribute more widely as beacons of good practice in the local community."

Our school has always worked collaboratively and in partnership with other Catholic schools in the diocese and we have now formalised these relationships by joining the trust and following the Bishop's directive. The trust will allow us to share expertise, training and resources in order to secure the best outcomes for our children and families. Please note the trust emblem above which will be added to our headed paper and website going forward.

In the short time we have been working together we have already...

- Hosted a joint training day with our partner schools on excellent EYFS provision ,
- Attended two peer reviews at St Peter's and St Thomas of Canterbury.
- I have attended the fortnightly Headteacher meetings.
- 4 teachers have taken part in the Trust Aspirant Leader programme which aims to fulfil Catholic leadership roles for the future.

- Subject leader termly meetings.
- Deputy Head termly meetings.
- SEND-co termly meetings.
- Whole school Moderation of RE, Writing and Maths.

### **Deputy Head**

Mrs Gutteridge will be retiring at Easter. She has worked at the school for 27 years. She will be a big loss to us and we will miss her greatly. She has led English in school for many years and the lovely new library that she has organised is one of her many positive contributions. We are currently looking for a new Deputy Head and I will update you when we appoint.

### **Maternity Leave Staff Changes**

Mrs Davis from Wrens class will be going on maternity leave at the end of Spring term and we wish her and her family all the best. To provide consistency for our Year 2 children Miss Bond will be teaching in Wrens. Miss Brosnan will teach in Owls class for four days, Tuesday to Friday supported by Mrs Cassar who will teach Owls class on Monday. Miss Williams and Mrs Warman are also due to go on maternity leave at the end of the summer term and we will inform you in due course of staffing arrangements for the next academic year.

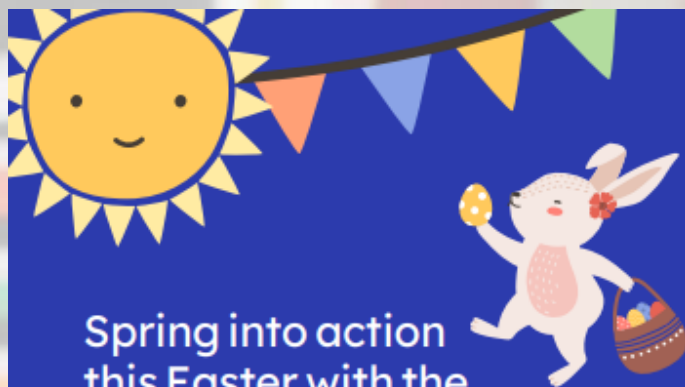

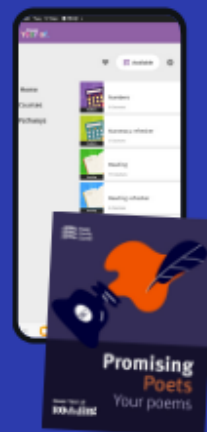
